

**Lake and Peninsula Borough
Ordinance 15-01**

An Ordinance Amending the Lake and Peninsula Borough Code, Section 2.08.010 (A), Establishing a Meeting Date for Regular Assembly meetings, and an Effective Date.

The Borough Assembly of Lake and Peninsula Borough finds and determines that:

1. The Charter, at Article II, Section 2.08(A), provides that the Manager shall hold at least one regular Assembly meeting every month.
2. The Borough Code presently provides that meeting to be at 10:00 am on the third Tuesday of each month.
3. The Assembly has, for several years, had a workshop the Monday night before the Assembly meeting to review the agenda and business. This meeting is teleconferenced.
4. The Assembly frequently visits a village on the Tuesday of the Assembly meeting to have the meeting as well as a community meeting. Due to the nature of visiting others' facilities, teleconferencing is not always available.
5. The Assembly would prefer to visit a village and be able to focus on the village needs and the citizens.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the Assembly of the Lake and Peninsula Borough:

Section 1. Classification

This is a code ordinance

Section 2. General Provisions

A. The Lake and Peninsula Borough Code, Section 2.08.101(A), is amended to read:

The manager shall schedule at least ~~one~~ nine regular meetings ~~on the third Tuesday of each year~~ month at ~~10:00 am~~ at such time, date and place as he/she may prescribe. Notice shall be posted at least ten (10) days prior to every meeting.

Section 3. Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption


