

**LAKE AND PENINSULA BOROUGH  
RESOLUTION 15-16**

**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE LAKE AND PENINSULA BOROUGH MULTI-  
JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN**

**WHEREAS** the Lake and Peninsula Borough is vulnerable to damages from natural hazard events which pose a threat to public health and safety and could result in property loss and economic hardship;

**WHEREAS** a Hazard Mitigation Plan (the Plan) was developed through the work of Lake and Peninsula Borough Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan (MJHMP) Planning Team, and interested parties within the Borough area;

**WHEREAS** the Plan recommends hazard mitigation actions that will protect people and property affected by natural hazards that face Borough residents, that will reduce future public, private, community, and personal costs of disaster response and recovery; and that will reinforce the Borough's leadership in emergency preparedness efforts;

**WHEREAS** the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (P.L. 106-390) (DMA 2000) and associated Federal regulations published under 44 CFR Part 201 require the Borough to formally adopt a Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan subject to the approval of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to be eligible for federal hazard mitigation projects and activities funds;

**WHEREAS** the Borough held public meetings or provided opportunities to receive comment on the Plan as required by DMA 2000;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Lake and Peninsula Borough Assembly that:

1. The Plan is hereby adopted as an official plan of the Lake and Peninsula Borough.
2. The Planning Team's officials identified in the Planning Process (Section 3) and the Mitigation Action Plan (Section 7) are hereby directed to implement the recommended actions assigned to them. These officials will report quarterly on their activities, accomplishments, and progress to the Assembly.
3. The Lake and Peninsula Borough Multi-Jurisdictional's Hazard Mitigation Planning Team will provide annual progress reports on the status of the implemented Mitigation Action Plan's projects to the Assembly. The Planning Team will submit this report to the Lake and Peninsula Borough Assembly annually by the Plan's adoption anniversary date.
4. The Lake and Peninsula Borough Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard's Planning Team, will complete periodic updates of the Plan as indicated in the Plan Maintenance Section (Section 3), but no less frequently than every five years or when determined by the State of Alaska or the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

5. The Plan includes the following communities: Chignik, Newhalen, Nondalton, Pilot Point, Port Alsworth and Port Heiden.


